## Background

The FGOV is a central and crucial meeting of the faculty with a diverse group of participants. Given the growing number of international students and staff members we need to find a good balance for the language to use in the participatory meetings, such as the FGOV.

## Policy

1. Baseline for the language policy is that we try to accommodate as many as possible participants with limited Dutch skills as well as participants with limited English skills (inclusiveness by parallel language use).
2. Guidelines to support inclusiveness can be found in [VU language policy](#). In summary this means:
  - a. If a subject is discussed in Dutch, participants may contribute in English, but should expect replies to be given in Dutch.
  - b. If a subject is discussed in English, participants may contribute in Dutch, but should expect replies to be given in English.
  - c. It is expected that participants passively understand Dutch/English (B2 level).
3. In addition to the VU language policy, FB decided on the following faculty guidelines for FGOV:
  - a. Agenda items concerning education, research, and valorization are discussed in English.
  - b. Other agenda items (such as organization, human-resource management) are discussed in Dutch.
  - c. The Faculty offers international members of the Student Council the possibility to train their Dutch skills (via the course 'Basic Dutch on Campus'). In particular passive language skills (understanding spoken and written Dutch text). Students who want to participate in FSR are expected to have A2 level at the start of their nomination and have the obligation to make an effort in raising this to at least B1 level. The Faculty fully compensates the financial costs for this course to achieve this.
  - d. The Faculty will make an effort to provide the FGOV minutes in English.
